They brought back previous members of staff who had left and did a special assembly with old pictures of me. Each of the classes made me a card; it was a really moving way to finish."

During her three decades Mrs Sanders has helped to teach several generations of families within the village including her own children Linda and Ian and her grandchildren James and Thomas.

# Parish Council

## Planning granted



In February Cornwall Council granted planning permission for the construction of two houses on land at the bottom of the New Inn car park (planning application reference: PA14/09321).

The New Inn is on Cornwall Council's list of assets of community value, with the effect that community interest groups can express an interest in bidding to buy the site. If an expression of interest is made, the owner of the site (Punch Taverns) is restricted from selling the land for a period of 6 months ending on 8 September. This issue will be discussed at the parish council meeting on Thursday 9 April.

## St Aubyn footpath



Taylor Wimpey expects to complete the construction of the 90 houses off Treliever Road within the next two months. Meanwhile, the issue of (the lack of) a footpath from the new estate through to the community hall and school rumbles on.

Back in February Cormac offered to provide some initial design advice free of charge, but in the period since then the relevant personnel appear to have 'gone to ground'. A path can only be constructed if the Mabe Youth & Community Project agrees to it happening – because MYCP owns the land. The potential path will be discussed (again) at the parish council meeting on 9 April, so if you want to express a view do come along.

## Affordable homes

Some of the last of the new estate's 90 new houses and flats are 'affordable homes', which will be allocated through Cornwall Council's Homechoice scheme. Preference will be given to applicants that have a local connection to Mabe. If you want to find out more contact:

After much delay, Cornwall Council has confirmed its commitment to implementing a dual-use crossing (i.e. pedestrians and cyclists) at the Kernick (Asda) roundabout. Cornwall Council has promised the parish council that by the end of March it will finalise a 'delivery programme'. As for when the work will be done, Cornwall Council has indicated that it is now looking at October (2015, I think!).

The Parish Council meets on Thursday 9 April and Thursday 14 May at 7.30pm in the WI Hall, Antron Hill. Members of the public are always given an opportunity to speak, so if there's something you want to raise, come along and raise it.

## Sports Centre planned for Tremough

In their tenth year of partnership at the Penryn Campus, the University of Exeter, Falmouth University and FXU (the Falmouth and Exeter Students' Union) have announced that they plan to develop a new £4M Sports Centre for the benefit of students, staff and the local community by Summer 2016.

Subject to the necessary planning consent, this new facility will include a 700sqm four-court sports hall, which will be suitable for hire as a multi-use venue, a 350sqm gym with up to 90 stations, a 150sqm fitness studio and changing rooms, all of which will adhere to Sport England guidance. The building will be highly sustainable and it is hoped that a 50-place nursery will be incorporated into the design, subject to additional funding being agreed.

This is also very good news for the

local community as Sport & Recreation Manager of the Penryn Campus Fitness Centre, Simon Court, explains: "A quarter of our existing gym members are local residents with no other connection to the universities and we will continue to offer external memberships with our relocation to the new Sports Centre and increased capacity. The new sports hall will also be accessible to local groups, subject to the timetabling of student-related activities, and in particular, during the five months outside the academic year when students are off campus. This is good news for sport, for Cornwall and for us all."

Following a four-month design and build tender process, Midas are the preferred contractor. Subject to successful negotiations over the design detail, specification and cost, and planning consent, it is hoped that construction will begin later this Summer.

## Chyan launches Crowdfunder appeal for new theatre

Residents and friends of Chyan Community Field, Halvasso have launched a Crowdfunder appeal to build an exciting new theatre for environmental training, gatherings and play.

Chyan Environmental Centre was established in 2002. From a disused, over-grown field of 2.2 acres it has been painstakingly developed by local volunteers and residents. The site now boasts allotments, wind turbines, a playground, sculpture trails and a community orchard. The outdoor theatre named *The Plen* is their latest project.

*The Plen* will enable the Chyan community to reach out and invite more people into nature. It will provide a space for courses in environmental and community farming, hold conferences on sustainable living, theatre, music and children's events.

*The Plen* takes its name from Cornish medieval amphitheatres. Plen An

Gwary's are a traditional Cornish 'place of play'. They have been used throughout history for gatherings that mark seasons and celebrate events.


Pledges through Crowdfunder will be used to build the theatre area using recycled materials. Chyan are also looking for volunteers to help with the build supervised by experts.

## Letter to the Editor

Dear Editor,

I am very concerned that Taylor Wimpey is coming to the end of their build in St Aubyn Park, but that they have still not provided a footpath for the new residents to access the school, village or play facilities.

The problem stems from the developers original plans, which wrongly assumed that the football pitch was a public field, and that therefore they could just make an opening onto it to form a footpath. The field is jointly owned and managed by Mabe Youth and Community Project and Mabe School and has to be locked during school hours to comply with safe guarding children standards.

When the mistake was highlighted to Cornwall Council, planning restrictions were imposed to ensure a suitable path was provided by Taylor

Wimpey before they sold any houses, but, due to technical errors in the restrictions, the developer was able to duck out of this responsibility.

I understand that a meeting has taken place between the developers and county and parish councillors but that no firm plans are in place. At the moment. it seems that MYCP has been placed in the middle of a battle not of its own making, and is expected by some to sort this muddle out, when that task should be undertaken by the developer and the councils. It has even been suggested that the football field is abandoned to allow a footpath to be built.

If other people are concerned I would urge them to write to their MP to make sure Taylor Wimpey fulfill their moral, if not their statutory, obligation.

## Editorial Board members needed for Mabe Matters


