Subject: FW: Antron Hill traffic, Mabe

Dear Councillor Williams,

We have the speed reading report for the eastern end and western end of the village of Mabe , please see attached reports. The recent speed readings were taken on the eastern end of Antron Hill near the junction of Cunningham Park. This was deemed the best location for the radarclass as it is within the built up village with frontages on the roadside. Here the speed limit is 30mph and the speed report shows a mean speed of approximately 30mph. The 85%ile is approximately 35mph.

On Antron Hill west, the most recent 2015 Radarclass results reflect the latest results after the Vehicle Activated Sign(VAS) was put in, and show that the VAS along with traffic calming is doing the job intended. The figures confirm there isn't a widespread issue, with mean speeds of approximately 25mph.

Despite the majority of drivers driving within the speed limit we do acknowledge there may be a small number of individuals exceeding the speed limit. We have asked the Police to look at both the eastern and western end of Antron Hill to hopefully deter speeding here.
